Young Drivers are 5 times more like to crash the car than an experienced driver.

The greatest risk faced by a young novice driver is in the period immediately following obtaining a licence for solo driving. Studies have noted that those who practiced more before passing a driving test have a lower crash rate. Training should be conducted in such a manner as to allow young, novice drivers to attain high levels of experience before solo driving. Pursue educational programmes and campaigns at an early stage, well before young people actually start driving, to actively encourage children to adopt safe attitude towards driving. Currently provide a range of Pre Driver Courses that allow 14 year olds upward to learn to drive off road safely and to become a very competent driver within 12 months of starting with us. Members tend to pass their driving test first time soon after turning 17 but also know the dangers of driving a car. We work with other local motor clubs and the Association of North West Car Clubs (ANWCC) provide a Production Car Championship for Junior Drivers.

First Aid & CPR can be included.

First Aid Fire Fighting.

Car Driving - assessing a safe driver.

Bike Riding - being a safe rider.

Drink or Drug Driving

This can cover a range of topics from the above that can be tailored to the school/groups needs. This is an interactive day with challenging videos and sessions, the instructors lead the students throughout the day to ensure full engagement from the students.
