

Blundell back in McLaren

RACING: Former Formula 1 star Mark Blundell returns to the wheel of a McLaren at Oulton Park this Easter weekend (30 March/1 April) in the Avon Tyres British GT Championship.

He joins a huge field of 33 cars entered for the 2013 season, which opens at the Cheshire circuit.

Mark will be racing for the United Autosports team, which has run an Audi R8 in the championship for the last two seasons, and introduced the McLaren MP4-12C to the series midway through 2012.

The Audi will return, alongside two McLarens, one of which will be driven by the 46 year-old.

Tickets for the Avon Tyres British GT Championship at Oulton Park are available from £18, with free entry for children aged 12 and under.

Entwistle hampered by problems

RALLYMAN Steve Entwistle had a devil's job trying to get to the finish of his first event of the year.

A puncture on the way to the start and then a broken drive coupling conspired to hand Steve a rare non-finish on last weekend's Devils Own Rally.

"I can't believe it, it was only my third retirement in 20 years," said Entwistle, who lives in Rishton.

"I got a puncture on the way to the start at Levens, near Kendal.

"It was made worse as it was on the A590 which was down to one lane so it was over two miles before we could pull off."

The first test saw Entwistle

and mapman Bob Hargreaves in great form, scoring equal fastest time in their ex-Roy Mapple Orangebox Mini.

The following forest tests saw the Mini Sport of Padiham-backed machine up into the top three before trouble struck.

"There was a bad knocking noise from the front of the car and it got steadily worse and worse," said Entwistle.

"By this time we were up in Shap and so decided to call it a day, as we had to drive the car home.

"We discovered the offside rubber drive coupling was breaking up, probably not helped by the puncture."

Merrills and McTear looking for top three in rally

CLITHEROE DMC pair Phil Merrills and Jason McTear will be aiming for a top three finish on this weekend's SMC Stages Rally.

And Merrills has an added incentive for wanting to do well on the Weeton-based event - he's sponsoring it.

"I wanted to put something back into a sport I've enjoyed for many years" said Phil, who owns Merrills Motor Services in Radcliffe.

"It's a cracking rally at a cracking venue with a cracking entry, and we are determined to get a good result."

Merrills and McTear are contesting the SD34 Stage Championship, the Blyton Challenge and selected events in the Isle of Man in their Honda Civic Type R.

But their opening rally, last week's Jack Neal Memorial, held at Blyton airfield in Lincolnshire, didn't quite go to plan.

"We were going well until we picked up a puncture on the first stage," said McTear.

"That dropped us seven minutes, which at a venue like Blyton, is almost impossible to claw back. Once we got a new rim on, the car ran perfectly all day."

McTear, who lives in Darwen, is planning a busy year of motorsport.

In addition to co-driving for

Merrills, he's hoping to contest the SD34 Road Rally Championship driving a Peugeot 309GTi with brother Dominic on the maps.

Events on the agenda include the Illuminations Rally, the Garstang and Preston Memorial, the Clitheronian and the Morecambe road rallies.

Meanwhile, organisers Stockport Motor Club are hoping for a full entry, but places are still available by visiting www.stockport061.co.uk.

East Lancashire entries include John Cope/Aimee Cope in a Subaru Impreza and Steve Johnson/Dave Barratt who will be competing in a Nissan Micra.

Tyre firm gives backing to drivers

FALKEN is backing young talent in motorsport through a new sponsorship and support scheme that will enable drivers access to subsidised and free tyres.

"The under-17 AutoSOLO championship in partnership with Falken aims to discover and nurture the future stars of UK motorsport," said Johnson.
