

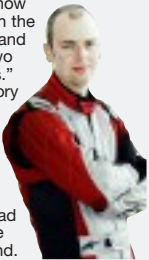
## Oily end to Barritt's race

**RALLY:** Daniel Barritt's Rally d'Italia Sardegna came to a premature end as he and Alastair Fisher were forced to retire their Ford Fiesta R2 midway through last Friday's opening stage of the rally.

A pipe to the oil cooler worked loose allowing all the oil content to drain from the engine leaving them stranded after less than four minutes competition.

It came as a huge blow to the pair's hopes of success in the FIA WRC Academy series as Barrowford-based Barritt said: "We put in a lot of effort for not a lot of gain. It was very disappointing as it was a rally that suited Alastair's driving style and we must now look to finish in the top five in Finland and win the two tarmac rounds."

Another victory for Egon Kaur sees the Estonian increase his lead in the championship standings ahead of July's Neste Oil Rally Finland.



## Dougie's crash-out

"Ian was fantastic, he didn't miss a single call throughout the two days," said Stone.

Their Legend Fires Skoda Fabia WRC ran faultlessly all weekend, their only problems coming with tyre selections.

Stone, pictured said: "The changing weather made tyre choices something of a lottery.

"They were very challenging conditions and some had big accidents so we were pleased to finish fifth after

finishing Friday's leg in 12th place."

Stone is now



looking ahead to the next round of the championship, the Jim Clark National Rally later this month, when Lee Carter will return to the co-driver's seat.

He said: "We finished third there last year and it would be nice to get a repeat of that result to, hopefully, retain the championship lead."
