## Knuzden Teenager Tops Safe Driving Contest.

Young drivers not only had the chance to learn new skills but the chance to drive in a fully prepared rally car when they took part in a safe driving initiative in Blackburn.

Organised by the Blackburn with Darwen's Casualty Reduction Team, in partnership with Capita Symonds and the Under 17 Motor Club Northwest, the event allowed drivers aged fourteen and upwards to take part. Approved Driving Instructors (ADIs) and Motorsport Instructors provided guidance, at the end of the course those taking part were assessed to determine who had made the most improvement during the day.

Identifying a winner was no easy task as the youngsters proved quick learners meaning there was little to choose between them come the end of the course. A decision had to be made though and **15 year-old Morgan Jackson from Knuzden**, who attends Our Lady & St Johns Catholic Art College, was declared the winner and he will now get to drive competitively in a Production Car Autotest event later this month. A delighted Jackson said "I didn't think I'd win! I've really enjoyed the day and learnt car control and the importance of concentrating at all times. I'm now looking forward to competing in the Production Car Autotest."

Jackson was encouraged to take part in the driving initiative by his grandfather Dean Roberts who said "Road safety is of paramount importance, instill it into them whilst they are young and hopefully it will stay with them for life."



Amongst those competing with Jackson for the prize drive was 16 vear-old Liam Martin from Oswaldtwistle. Martin, former а Accrington Academy student who is set to continue his studies at Accrington & Rossendale College in September, said "It's been good, I've enjoyed it!"

The Under 17 Motor Club Northwest organised Autotest that ran in tandem with the road initiative safety was aimed at more experienced young drivers and Accrington 15 year-old Jack Foster, who attends Rhyddings & Business Enterprise School, finished as runnerup.



Blackburn with Darwen Road Safety Officer Steve Johnson who played a major role in organising the event said "Driver experience days are available up and down the country, but their primary focus is in providing thrills and experiences rather than developing the driver's skills and improving their safety attitudes. This was a fun event with a serious side and people taking part went away with a wealth of experience, hints, tips and knowledge to help make them safer drivers in the future."

Steve was particularly keen to point out the advantages to the youngsters who took part saying "Events like this give the fourteen year-olds a three-year head start whereby they can learn valuable driving skills and responsibility before venturing onto the roads for the first time."

The theory element is an excellent way to promote knowledge & understanding, attitudes & beliefs and to develop a coping strategy to help deal with issues that may occur on a day-to-day basis.

The practical element has its own true value making life easier for the developing teenager when ready with provisional entitlement to grasp the true concept of learning to drive on today's busy roads in a safe Eco friendly manner. The DSA prides itself on Safe Driving for Life and the Pre Driver package prepares and equips young people with the right skill sets to be able to carry out this message from an early age and in my opinion can only contribute towards safer roads for the future."

**Nineteen year-old Hazel Johnson from Accrington**, who learnt to drive at a young age, is now a regular competitor in the Formula 1000 Rally series and she appreciates the advantages the course offers to those with motorsport aspirations. She said "The courses contributed to giving me the knowledge and understanding of what is safe on the road and what should be kept to the track; which now is something I try to focus on when conducting motorsport presentation in schools for Go Motorsport."

Morgan Jackson will make his motorsport debut on Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> August when he competes on Accrington Motorsport Club's Clubmans Production Car Autotest at the Blackburn & Darwen M65 Motorway Services.
